Parish Ponderings

Our Village Churches Part 2

In the February magazine I said I'd answer some of the questions I put about our village churches, why they are what they are. To understand them we need to appreciate the importance of Christianity eight hundred years ago and what has happened since.

Unless you were wealthy life was pretty grim. Power and wealth lay with landowners - The Crown, Aristocracy and the Church. Most people had no land, no money and were dependant for employment on the people with power. Churches were built either by Monasteries or by the Aristocracy. They were built East to West because East is where Jerusalem is. You were "expected" to attend the church of your employer every week. During the reign of Elizabeth I you were fined £20 a month for not attending church each Sunday.

Going to church became a way of life. The church was the social hub of the village. Some churches brewed their own beer. The church was the courthouse, the council chamber and the theatre (no village halls then). The church was for Matches, Hatches and Dispatches. You were married, baptised and buried, sometimes literally, in church. The wealthy paid to have their graves inside the holy building for a better chance of going to heaven! The North side was seen as the Devil's territory so only paupers were buried there. In the Middle Ages, most people were buried in shrouds rather than coffins. The dead were carried to the lych gate (a gate with a roof) and placed on a bier, where the priest conducted the first part of the funeral service under its temporary shelter.

Church bells called people to worship and later, if the church had a tower, clocks were installed facing the village to tell everyone the time. The hour was usually struck by the tenor bell - the loudest - to let the workers in the fields know the time. Before clocks could be afforded sundials were carved on the walls of the church. There are two on St Mary's tower wall.

So next time you are in one of our three churches for worship or to have a look around, consider the history of the building. Is there a clock, does it chime, are there tomb stones in the floor, are there any stained glass windows, are there any wall paintings? Have a look outside, is the North side a bit empty of graves, are there any sundials, is there a lych gate?


